New 2024 Riverbank & Riparian Buffer Project-Piedmont University: In a recent meeting with Marshall Criser, Piedmont University President, it was agreed that the SRWA would partner with his Environmental Department, led by Debra Dooley to begin a December 2024 Hazel Creek bank restoration project on campus. The restored buffer area will add immediate erosion control and the filtering of any water run-off toxins that flow from campus property into Hazel Creek.

The new project will involve a one-hundred-foot area on both sides of the creek that will be fully restored with new plant vegetation and native trees. Overall, the restoration effort will be an ongoing project for both the SRWA and the Piedmont University Environmental Department. Each year's class will continue to use the newly restored area for educational purposes and infield training opportunities.

Based on a recent partnering agreement with the Victory Home Recovery Center, located in Tallulah Falls, the SRWA now has a new sourcing option for those riverbank projects requiring added vegetation in the form of plants, shrubs, and trees.

It is important to share with our community that the SRWA is actively engaged in doing those projects that will continue to make a difference....a task we own and will continue to do!

The SRWA wants to thank Piedmont University for their willingness to participate in this very important restoration-based project. The community thanks you!



New 2025 Riverbank & Riparian Buffer Projects Pending:

The SRWA is presently working to execute several new 2025 riverbank development projects on Goshen Creek and Highway 197 that will restore the vitally important riparian buffers to over 500+ yards of Soque riverbank area.

The value of these projects not only involve creating new root systems that will structurally reinforce riverbank areas up and down the Soque River, but will create added tree canopies that will greatly reduce water temperatures during the hot summer months.

The SRWA is working diligently with willing Soque River property owners to drive new cost-effective vegetation programs that begins a ten-to-fifteen-year effort to restore our riparian buffer zones. If we can continue to restore 500+ yards of riverbank annually over the next ten to twenty years the positive impact will be monumental. Just imagine new highly vegetative riverbanks throughout the Soque watershed. Letting nature take over the critical process of filtering water run-off, adding needed shade, and providing new root-based riverbank areas as we find viable ways to protect our water system during those periods of flooding!

SRNA: Honoring our Stewardship Commitment!

An organization's viability can be gauged by their ability to connect with community through the value they generate!! The key question is.... are you relevant and are you making a true difference!

The key indicators are as follows:

- A membership that represents a diverse and balanced cross-section of the community!
- A effective social media platform that connects and informs!
- Execution of local work projects and programs that are results oriented!
- The organization's ability and willingness to help and work with others!

Membership: The SRWA is quite proud of their 200+ annual membership-base of dedicated and committed volunteers that has been maintained over the last twenty-six years. A committed group of local residents from all walks of life that are driven by their love of community and where they live!

Social Media Campaign: The SRWA now has a newly enhanced social messaging effort with an elevated presence on Facebook, and a fully engaging new website at www.soque.org. This new digital focus is transforming the organization's visibility and value with not only our membership, but with the local community throughout Habersham County. The organization is also publishing a quarterly SRWA Newsletter allowing those interested to know more about the SRWA Team and their efforts. The newsletter is emailed to over 1500 people who have a strong desire to stay informed about key SRWA events, river work projects, and local community initiatives.

River Work Projects: As with most environmental work project efforts, it requires money and manpower to get them started. Overall, it has taken the organization a full twelve-months to accrue adequate funding for two new riverbank restoration projects (i.e., Hazel Creek on the Piedmont University Campus and a section of Rocky Branch Creek near the Habersham County Tax Commissioner Office). The SRWA is now able to not only fund the programs, but to resource native vegetation for both restoration projects.

Working and Helping Others: The SRWA will continue to find those community partners that we can assist or help, like those listed below:

- **Victory Home**: a male-oriented drug rehab center located in Tallulah Falls that the SRWA helps support and in return they grow the native plants, trees, and shrubs for our annual riverbank restoration and buffer projects
- Local Schools (i.e. Habersham Middle School, Trinity Classical, and Tallulah Falls): The SRWA can continue to provide their environmental expertise and knowledge to students throughout Habersham County. The program's focus is to better inform and educate younger citizens about the importance of keeping our environment healthy and our water clean now and into the future. Today's SRWA Outreach Educational Program is fully funded by the organization, and is provided at no charge to any local school system or group.
- Habersham County-UGA Extension-Clarkesville Office: Under the directorship of Steven Patrick, the SRWA has found a new and dedicated partner that is focused on the agricultural side of keeping our river water levels of E. coli low and our riverbank structure secure with new trees and vegetation.
- Universities and College Campuses: Currently the SRWA is actively engaged with North Georgia Technical College, and Piedmont University with the implementation of annual internships involving environmental and water testing program efforts.
- New Stewardship Role over the Soque Greenway Trail-Clarkesville, GA: It was this last April when the SRWA assumed the management over the Soque Greenway Nature Trail (SGT). Since that time, the trail has had a full makeover including a new welcome sign, entrance archway, rebuilt information center, refurbished walking bridge, new sitting benches, three new doggie waste cans, etc. An SRWA expenditure of over \$12,000 has given this wonderful walking trail new life and value within its community!

Soque Watershed Quality Testing Program



In January 2025 the SRWA will be executing a new user-friendly water quality data sharing program that involves the use of QR Codes located at specific water location sites throughout Habersham County. The initial execution of the QR code sign effort will begin at Pitts Park, the Soque Greenway Trail, and other key sites to be identified in the very near future.

Once the QR code symbol is scanned by your phone you will be immediately taken to a website page where water quality data will be available for the water location you are visiting. The information provided with be directional in nature along with current E. Coli (bacterial) readings. If the E. Coli levels are high or outside of normal, please do not wade or let your dog drink from the creek or river. The effort behind the program is to "best" inform each of you of whether the water you are near is safe for recreation or animal consumption.



This important service offered by the SRWA Organization is to provide vital "real time" information to our community concerning Soque River and tributary water quality levels. Your health and the watershed's wellbeing is very important to us!




